Q1

Which country manufactures the most toys in the world?

China

Fact: China produces around 80% of the world's dolls and toys

Q2

True or false. For transportation, why do you need packaging on an Easter egg?

To protect the product on its journey, to have the product ready for the shop and to control temperature

Fact: Whilst prices can be part of packaging, it is not essential for transportation. You can have specific packaging to regulate temperature, but it depends on the product.

Q3

Which continent grows and exports the most bananas?

South America

Fact: Ecuador is the largest producing country of bananas

Q4

Approximately, how long does it take a plane to fly from London to Florida, USA (the home of the Walt Disney World Resort)?

8 hours

Fact: The Walt Disney World Resort, also called Walt Disney World and Disney World, is near the cities of Orlando and Kissimmee.

Q5

How tall are the quay cranes at the UK port London Gateway?

138 metres

Fact: This is taller than a football pitch in length!

Q6

Amelia Earhart is famous for what?

She was the first female to fly solo across the Atlantic Ocean

Fact: During an attempt to make a circumnavigational flight of the globe in 1937, Earhart disappeared over the central Pacific Ocean.

Q7

If you wanted to get one tonne of sweets from America to the UK, what methods of transport could you use?

Air or sea

Fact: Road and rail are not usually an option for transportation to and from the USA due to the Atlantic Ocean.

Q8

What modes of transport could we use to get cargo to France?

Air, road, sea and rail

Fact: France is probably the most accessible country from the UK. Road and rail can use the Channel tunnel, to make getting there, very quick and easy.

Q9

What did the Wright brothers invent?

They are generally credited with inventing, building, and flying the world's first successful motor-operated airplane

Fact: Their plane was called the Kitty Hawk and the flight, in 1903 lasted just 12 seconds!

Q10

The famous engineer, Isambard Kingdom Brunel, is famous for designing and constructing which of these?

Railway lines, bridges, tunnels and docks

Fact: At the time of his death in 1859, Brunel is estimated to have been worth about £8 million in today's money.
