Customs Declaration Service (CDS) migration communications Phase 2 key messages

In this phase of activity, we will build on the awareness and 'call for action' created in Phase 1 whilst driving a greater sense of urgency to start moving across, promote the benefits of why they should move and the help available via intermediaries. We will ensure the audience understands the complexity and the amount of time it takes to move across to CDS and we will use the experience of those who are declaring on CDS to help and encourage others to make the move.

This revised messaging will be used for communications taking place over the course of June 2022

Overarching key messages for this phase are:

 Act now to move across to the Customs Declaration Service - you have less than four months before CHIEF closes and you must make all your import declarations on the Customs Declaration Service

The Customs Declaration Service is ready to use for making import and export declarations when moving goods into and out of the UK. The service will replace the old Customs Handling Import and Export Freight (CHIEF), marking the first step of the UK border transformation. It represents a significant upgrade on CHIEF by providing businesses with a more user-friendly, streamlined system that offers greater functionality.

You need to plan your move to the Customs Declaration Service now so that you can continue trading. You need to do this whether you make your own declarations or use a customs agent or express operator. The sooner you start, the easier it will be – it can take some time, depending on the size and nature of your business.

Before 30 September, you must make sure you have a <u>customs agent</u> ready to make your import declarations on the Customs Declaration Service or set yourself up to make your own declarations.

After 30 September, CHIEF will close for import declarations and you'll need to make these on the Customs Declaration Service. The ability to make export declarations will end and the CHIEF service will close on 31 March 2023.

We've found businesses who have used the Trader Dress Rehearsal service have a higher declaration success rate and find it easier to move all their declarations from CHIEF to the Customs Declaration Service.

It's important that you move to the Customs Declaration Service by 30 September 2022 to continue trading.

If your business is VAT registered, you may already be using the Customs Declaration Service for VAT purposes. Please check with your organisation to find out if you're already registered and make sure we have the right contact details for your business. This will make sure you receive our regular customs information emails.

If you're making declarations on both the Customs Declaration Service and CHIEF, you can use the same duty deferment account. However, you'll need to set up separate direct debit instructions on both CHIEF and the Customs Declaration Service. Only declarations submitted on the Customs Declaration Service will be collected via the Direct Debit set up on it. Similarly, only declarations submitted on CHIEF will be collected via the Direct Debit set up in CHIEF. You won't be charged twice for the same declaration.

Only declarations submitted on the Customs Declaration Service will be collected via the Direct Debit set up on it. Declarations submitted on CHIEF will be collected via the Direct Debit set up in CHIEF. Your customer won't be charged twice for the same liability.
